Epsom Downs

Best known for hosting the infamous Epsom Derby, Epsom Downs is a Grade 1 racecourse with a crowd capacity of 120,000. Just 15 minutes from Reigate Manor, you can visit by car or train. Perhaps you'll spot Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II alighting from the British Royal Train on race days?

Denbies Wine Estate

Family owned & run since 1984, it has become one of the largest wine producers in the United Kingdom. Reigate Castle

Channel your inner King or Queen and take a trip to Reigate Castle. The grounds are a public park where you can take a stroll and imagine what it may have been like hundreds of years ago. Why not embark on a tour of the Baron's and Tunnel Road caves which take place on the 2nd Saturday of every month between May and September.




Priory Farm

This impressive local produce store is located less than four miles away from the hotel, in South Nutfield, Redhill. It is a much-loved destination for food lovers and families. Reigate Hill Walk

Priory Park

Priory Park in Reigate hosts a fantastic children's play area with water features, a huge pirate ship and a zip wire. For sports fans there are four tennis courts, a skate park, cricket square, croquet lawn, football pitches & multi use games area. There are also beautiful formal gardens, a lake & woodland, all located close to the historic Reigate High Street.

Shopping in Reigate

Donyngs Leisure Centre

Reigate Museum

Located in Reigate Priory School in the park, the museum contains local history aimed at both adults and children.
